Mrs. William Boulton Was Detained Abroad Because of War's Menace

After being detained in England for some time by the war after she was ready to return home, Mrs. William Boulton, of 308 Hotart Street, had the unusual experience of returning under the escort of two British warships. The situation in the cities that have been attacked is appalling, she said, and the residents there are always living in fear. Many of them have moved to other places. By great precaution is being taken to protect the towns and the people from German attack and in addition to the British warships that patrol the coast the residents of the streets are compelled to regard certain orders and restrictions laid down by the government. In these towns street lights are not allowed to burn at night and the residents must stay in their houses at the outside. This is done so that the enemy will not be able to locate a town at night by the lights that would otherwise burn in the streets and show from the windows of the houses.
